# A Message From Leadership

Dear Friends of the Red Cross,

Around the world, around the nation, around the corner this past fiscal year was an incredibly busy year for the American Red Cross. Around the world, the Red Cross was faced with a devastating disaster on December 26, when a tsunami struck southern Asia, ripping apart the lives of millions of people living along the coasts of the Indian Ocean. Almost immediately, students, parents, children, businesses, social organizations, and schools in and around the Quad Cities united and stepped forward in a manner that humbled and inspired us all. The generous outpouring of support from the Quad Cities area raised over \$1.2 million locally to help the tsunami relief efforts.

# Disaster Services

Joe and Ruth Ann Jackson of Joy, Illinois were cooking fish in their garage when a grease fire occurred, causing major damage to their newly renovated home. The fire was so intense that it rippled the siding on their neighbor's home, which was 100 feet away. When a Red Cross volunteer showed up at their home, Ruth Ann was sitting in a lawn chair on her driveway, completely stunned. "I know it's just stuff," she said looking at the burnt remains of her home, "It can be replaced." Firefighters from Joy, Aledo, New Boston, Eliza, and Keithsburg responded to the fire and the Red Cross responded immediately, ensuring that the Jacksons' had a place to stay and adequate food and clothing. "I'd just like to let everybody know we appreciate all our firefighters, the Red Cross, and the people of the community," said Joe.

# Armed Forces Emergency Services

**F**rom sending parcels during World War II to US prisoners captured by the Germans to relaying emergency communications during the war with Iraq, the Red Cross has been there. Derrick Anthony is a member of the 1st Marine Division 3rd Battalion that was stationed for twelve months in Iraq. Derrick says, “We had a couple people take emergency leave for loved ones back home that were terminally ill and/or dying. The Red Cross worked so fast to get information to us about problems back home. The Red Cross helped during those sad times, and we were so grateful for that.” In

August, Derrick was injured in Iraq when a bomb exploded and he was hit with shrapnel in the leg. Derrick’s parents in Matherville, Illinois, contacted the Red Cross for help. Within twenty-four hours, the Red Cross was able to provide information on Derrick’s condition and get a message to him from his family. Derrick recovered from his injuries and received a Purple Heart for his work in Iraq. “We are so grateful to the Red Cross for helping us when Derrick was hurt. It was a very scary time for our family,” says Derrick’s mother, Fran.

- **Last year, the American Red Cross of the Quad Cities Area provided emergency services for 489 members of the US Armed Forces and their families.**
- The Red Cross worldwide emergency communications network operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- We help families send emergency messages regarding the death or serious illness of a family member, the birth of a child, or other family emergency. The Red Cross also has licensed mental health professionals available for military personnel and their families to provide guidance, information, referrals, and other needs.
- The Red Cross is the only organization to facilitate emergency communications for military members.

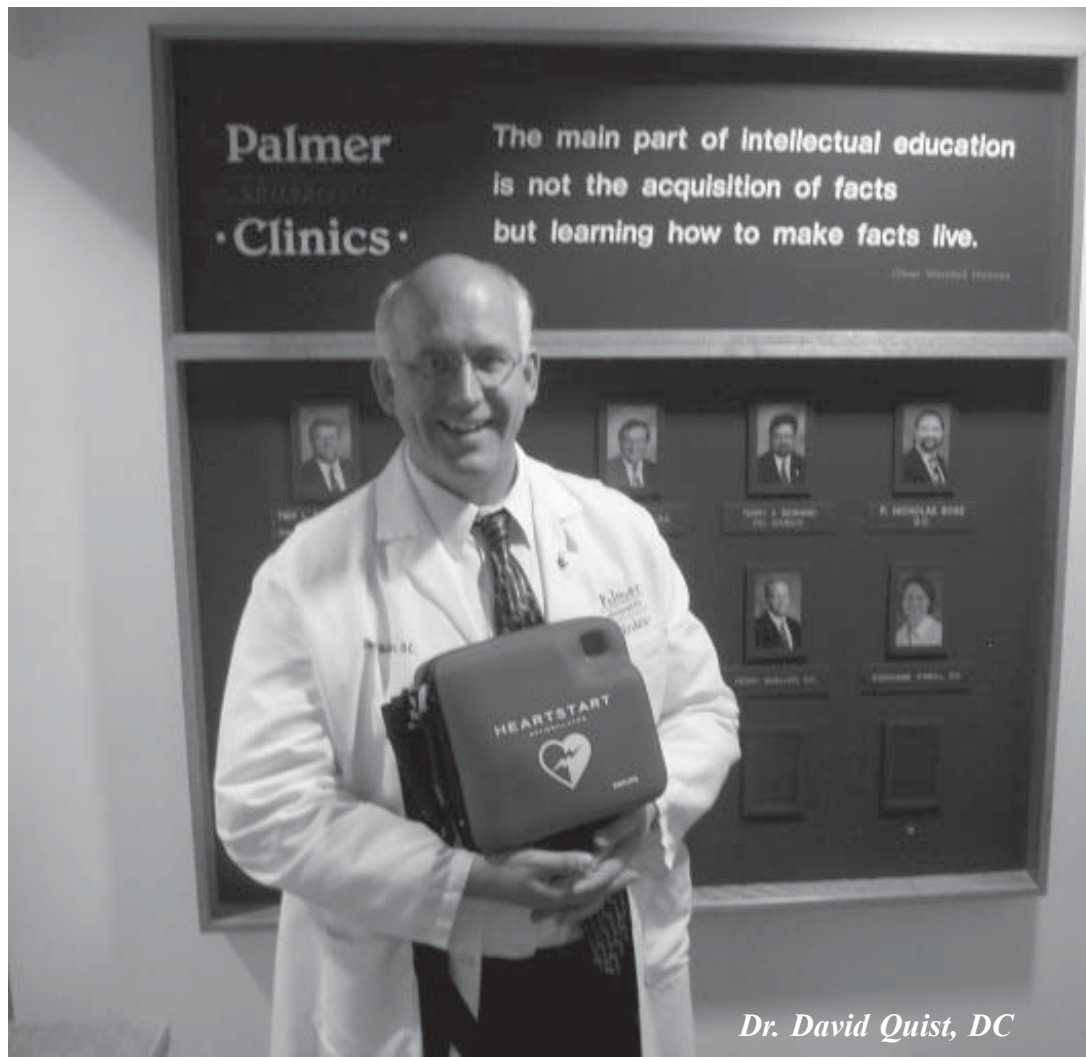




# Health & Safety Services

Palmer College of Chiropractic is demonstrating their commitment to ensure everyone on their campus is safe and secure. Palmer currently trains over 450 students annually in Red Cross CPR and first aid. During the summer, they purchased four AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators) to enable them to do even more to save lives from sudden cardiac arrest.

Approximately every one to two minutes, someone collapses in sudden cardiac arrest. Although heart disease is a common cause, many victims have no prior warning symptoms, are active and seemingly fit. A sobering 13 percent of workplace deaths are caused by cardiac arrest. Dr. David Quist, DC, a faculty clinician at Palmer College, was a catalyst in the college's decision to implement AEDs on campus. Dr. Quist says, "As primary care physicians, we need to be prepared to respond to any emergency that might arise with state of the art equipment. This new application (AED) gives us the most current application available for life savers to access when they are called upon."

- In the past year, the American Red Cross of the Quad Cities Area trained more than 23,381 people with life-saving skills in CPR, first aid, and AEDs.
- In addition, 7,120 individuals were trained in learn-to-swim, lifeguarding, and water safety instruction classes.
- Our chapter educated 2,446 people in HIV/AIDS awareness and education and provided 599 residents with free blood pressure checks to help prevent stroke, heart attack, heart failure, and kidney failure.
- A trusted leader in health and safety education, the American Red Cross of the Quad Cities Area teaches people how to avoid emergencies, lead safer, healthier lives, and change the outcomes of potentially fatal situations.



# Volunteer & Youth Services

Twice this year, the Red Cross office was home to a week-long Kids K.A.M.P. (Kids Are More Prepared) to teach children necessary safety skills. A total of

74 children between the ages of five and 12 were trained at Kids K.A.M.P. The children enjoyed the Moline Fire Department's Safety House and Severe Weather Simulator, lessons on animal care and safety from the Quad City Animal Welfare Center, nutrition information from Miss Iowa Runner-Up, and a visit from Sparky the fire safety dog. Children also participated in Escape School, a role-play simulation designed to teach children how to escape from abduction and handle approaches from strangers, child identification cards, and disaster preparedness information. "We have identified an important need in our community for inexpensive, educational day camps for Quad Cities youth. The children involved in Red Cross Kids K.A.M.P. benefitted from a variety of health and safety activities ranging from how to respond to an emergency at home to how to make healthy snack choices." says Kim Crosby, Coordinator of Youth Services.

- **In the past year, over 180 area youth volunteered and taught Red Cross courses and, along with AmeriCorps members, trained 9,402 local children.**
- Red Cross clubs are active at Moline, Sherrard, and United Township High Schools and Logan Elementary School in Illinois; Bettendorf Middle School, and Assumption High School, and a peer educator group at Bettendorf High School in Iowa.
- At all hours of the day and night, Red Cross volunteers help people after fires, floods, tornadoes, and other disasters; volunteers teach people to save lives, live safer and prepare; staff blood drives; and keep the Red Cross operating every day.
- The American Red Cross of the Quad Cities Area has over 650 volunteers, spanning all ages, working with youth, teaching CPR, working in hospitals, at the chapter office, and community events.



# Blood Services

**P**hil Good of Kewanee, Illinois, has donated over eight gallons of blood to the American Red Cross. Phil started giving in the early 1950's after a fireman that he worked with went to give blood and took him along. "Giving blood is something that I feel very deeply about. It makes sense and it takes so little time! I enjoy making a contribution that will ultimately help save someone else's life and that's what life is all about - helping others."



- **With the help of the Heart of America Blood Services Region, volunteers helped collect 2,403 units of blood in Henry and Mercer counties.**
- **Every day, 6.5 units of blood are collected, potentially saving the lives of 18 people.**
- The American Red Cross is the nation's largest single supplier of blood, plasma, and tissue.
- These blood and blood components are used in emergency services, in the treatment of cancer patients and for people with blood disorders, and in other lifesaving treatments that benefit countless individuals across the country.
- Since establishing the first civilian blood service after World War II, the American Red Cross has been a leader in blood collection, safety, and development. Today, the safety and availability of the blood supply is our highest priority.
